IN THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

Mr. PATMAN introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Banking and Currency

---

## A BILL

To provide for continuation of authority for regulation of exports,  
and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*  
3       That section 12 of the Export Control Act of 1949, as  
4       amended, is repealed.

5       SEC. 2. Section 5 of the Export Control Act of 1949, as  
6       amended, is amended by adding at the end thereof subsec-  
7       tions (c), (d), and (e), as follows:

8       “(c) The head of any department or agency exercising  
9       any functions under this Act (and officers or employees of  
10       such department or agency specifically designated by the  
11       head thereof) may impose a civil penalty not to exceed

1 \$1,000 for each violation of this Act or any regulation,  
2 order, or license issued hereunder, either in addition to or  
3 in lieu of any other liability or penalty which may be  
4 imposed.

5 “(d) The head of any department or agency exercising  
6 any functions under this Act (and officers or employees of  
7 such department or agency specifically designated by the  
8 head thereof) may compromise and settle any administra-  
9 tive proceeding commenced with respect to any violation  
10 of this Act or any regulation, order, or license issued here-  
11 under, upon payment of a sum not to exceed \$1,000 for  
12 each such violation.

13 “(e) The amount of any penalty imposed or sum to  
14 be paid in compromise and settlement pursuant to subsec-  
15 tions (c) and (d) of this section shall be payable into the  
16 Treasury of the United States and shall be recoverable in  
17 a civil suit in the name of the United States. Nothing con-  
18 tained in those subsections shall be construed to limit in  
19 any way (i) the availability of other administrative remedies  
20 with respect to violations of this Act or any regulation,  
21 order, or license issued hereunder, (ii) the authority to com-  
22 promise and settle administrative proceedings brought with  
23 respect to violations of this Act or any regulation, order, or  
24 license issued hereunder on terms which do not require the

1 payment of money, or (iii) the authority to compromise,  
2 remit, or mitigate seizures and forfeitures pursuant to the  
3 Act of August 13, 1953 (67 Stat. 577).”
