REPORT

[To accompany H.J. Res. 780]

The Committee on Banking and Currency, to whom was referred the joint resolution (H.J. Res. 780) to provide for a temporary extension of the authority conferred by the Export Control Act of 1949, having considered the same, report favorably thereon without amendment and recommend that the joint resolution do pass.

PURPOSE OF THE JOINT RESOLUTION

The enactment of the proposed legislation will extend the Export Control Act of 1949 for 2 months, to August 30, 1969. The Export Control Act furnishes the basic authority for control of exports to Communist-bloc countries. It furnishes the authority for restricting the outflow of scarce materials, as well as the authority to regulate exports in furtherance of the foreign policy and national security of the United States. The temporary extension of the Export Control Act, which would otherwise expire on June 30, 1969, will enable the committee to complete its deliberations.

CHANGES IN TEXT OF EXISTING STATUTES

SECTION 12 OF THE EXPORT CONTROL ACT OF 1949, AS AMENDED  
(50 U.S.C. App. 2032)

TERMINATION DATE

SEC. 12. The authority granted herein shall terminate on **June 30, 1969,** *August 30, 1969*, or upon any prior date which the Congress by concurrent resolution or the President may designate.
