1 EAST-WEST TRADE AND FREEDOM OF EMIGRATION

2 SEC. 507. (a) To assure the continued dedication of the
3 United States to fundamental human rights, and notwith-
4 standing any other provision of this Act or any other law,
5 after October 15, 1972, no nonmarket economy country shall
6 be eligible to receive most-favored-nation treatment or to
7 participate in any program of the Government of the United
8 States which extends credits or credit guarantees or invest-
9 ment guarantees, directly or indirectly, during the period
10 beginning with the date on which the President of the
11 United States determines that such country—

12 (1) denies its citizens the right or opportunity to
13 emigrate; or

14 (2) imposes more than a nominal tax on emigration
15 or on the visas or other documents required for emi-
16 gration, for any purpose or cause whatsoever; or

1 (3) imposes more than a nominal tax, levy, fine,
2 fee, or other charge on any citizen as a consequence of
3 the desire of such citizen to emigrate to the country of
4 his choice,

5 and ending on the date on which the President determines
6 that such country is no longer in violation of paragraph (1),
7 (2), or (3).

8 (b) After October 15, 1972, a non-market-economy
9 country may participate in a program of the Government of
10 the United States which extends credits or credit guarantees
11 or investment guarantees, and shall be eligible to receive
12 most-favored-nation treatment, only after the President of
13 the United States has submitted to the Congress a report
14 indicating that such country is not in violation of paragraph
15 (1), (2), or (3) of subsection (a). Such report, with re-
16 spect to such country, shall include information as to the
17 nature and implementation of emigration laws and policies
18 and restrictions or discrimination applied to or against per-
19 sons wishing to emigrate. The report required by this sub-
20 section shall be submitted initially as provided herein and
21 semiannually thereafter so long as any agreement entered
22 into pursuant to the exercise of such authority is in effect.

Intended to be proposed by Mr. BUCKLEY (for himself and Mr. DOMINICK) to H.R. 6767, an Act to promote the development of an open, nondiscriminatory, and fair world economic system, to stimulate the economic growth of the United States, and to provide the President with additional negotiating authority therefor, and for other purposes, viz: On page 81, after line 12, insert the following new section:

1 SEC. 507. INTERFERENCE WITH BROADCASTS BY
2 UNITED STATES.—(a) Notwithstanding any other pro-
3 vision of this Act or any other law, after the date of the
4 enactment of this Act, no nonmarket economy country shall
5 be eligible to receive most-favored-nation treatment or to
6 participate in any program of the Government of the United
7 States which extends credits or credit guarantees or invest-

1 ment guarantees, directly or indirectly, during the period
2 beginning with the date on which the President of the United
3 States determines that such country is interfering with the
4 reception by citizens or residents of such country of radio
5 or television broadcasts from stations operated, or funded in
6 whole or in part, by the Government of the United States
7 or any agency thereof, and ending on the date on which
8 the President determines that such country is no longer
9 interfering with the reception of such broadcasts by citizens
10 or residents of such country.

11 (b) After the date of the enactment of this Act, a
12 nonmarket economy country may participate in a program
13 of the Government of the United States which extends
14 credits or credit guarantees or investment guarantees, and
15 shall be eligible to receive most-favored-nation treatment,
16 only after the President of the United States has submitted
17 to the Congress a report indicating that such country is not
18 interfering with the reception by citizens or residents of such
19 country of radio or television broadcasts described in sub-
20 section (a). The report required by this subsection shall be
21 submitted initially as provided herein and semiannually
22 thereafter so long as any agreement entered into pursuant to
23 the exercise of such authority is in effect.
