To reauthorize title II of the Marine Protection, Research, and Sanctuaries Act of 1972, for fiscal years 1989 and 1990, and for other purposes.

IN THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

Mr. LOWRY of Washington (for himself, Mr. JONES of North Carolina, Mr. STUDDS, Mr. SAXTON, Mr. HUGHES, and Mr. DAVIS of Michigan) introduced the following bill; which was referred jointly to the Committees on Merchant Marine and Fisheries and Science, Space, and Technology

A BILL

To reauthorize title II of the Marine Protection, Research, and Sanctuaries Act of 1972, for fiscal years 1989 and 1990, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 That title II of the Marine Protection, Research, and Sanctu-
4 aries Act of 1972 (33 U.S.C. 1441-1445), be amended—

5 SECTION 1. By adding the following new subsection to
6 section 202(a) (33 U.S.C. 1442(a)):

7 “(3) The Secretary of Commerce shall ensure that the
8 comprehensive and continuing research program conducted
9 under subsection (a) of this section is consistent with the

1 comprehensive plan relating to the ocean pollution developed
2 under section 4 of the National Ocean Pollution Planning Act
3 of 1978 (33 U.S.C. 1703).”

4 SEC. 2. By adding the following new subsection to sec-
5 tion 204 (33 U.S.C. 1444):

6 “(c) On October 31 of each year, the Under Secretary
7 shall report to the Congress the specific programs that the
8 National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration and the
9 Environmental Protection Agency carried out pursuant to
10 this title in the previous fiscal year, specifically listing the
11 amount of funds allocated to those specific programs in the
12 previous fiscal year.”.

13 SEC. 3. (a) By amending section 205 (33 U.S.C. 1445)
14 by striking out “and” immediately following “fiscal year
15 1986,”.

16 (b) By striking out “1987.” and substituting “1987, not
17 to exceed \$12,000,000 for fiscal year 1989, and
18 \$13,000,000 for fiscal year 1990.”.
